
Chart 3. Growth of health insurance coverage.

In 1948, only 60 million Americans were protected by insurance for hospitalization, the most expensive part of modern medical care. By the end of 1958, more than 123 million people were insured against hospital expenses, 111 million were insured against surgical expenses, and 75 million were insured against regular medical costs of nonsurgical physician care.
