## Crop Spraying-Private Aircraft Order

## AIR NAVIGATION ORDER, SERIES VII, No. 1

## CROP SPRAYING—PRIVATE AIRCRAFT

- 1. In this Order, "farmer" means a person whose chief source of income is from farming.
- 2. No farmer shall use or permit the use of his aircraft in the aerial spraying or dusting of crops unless,
  - (a) as pilot-in-command he has not less than 150 hours flight time as pilot-in-command, including not less than 25 hours flight time on the type of aircraft being used,
  - (b) when the aircraft is flown by a person other than a farmer, the pilot is the holder of a valid Commercial Pilot Licence,
  - (c) the spray tanks or dust hoppers have been installed in a manner that prevents danger to occupants of the aircraft from the dusting or spraying material, and
  - (d) only the minimum necessary flight crew members are carried on spraying or dusting flights.
- 3. Except as authorized by the appropriate air traffic control unit, the aerial spraying and dusting of crops shall not be conducted within a control zone.
