

WARSAW CONVENTION (PROTOCOL)

NOTE

A Protocol to the Warsaw Convention was opened for signature at The Hague on September 28, 1955. *It is not in force at the present writing, December 31, 1957, and has not been ratified by the United States.* However, having been signed by the representatives of 29 countries, including the United States, it is reproduced herein for convenient reference. The conditions necessary to bring the Protocol into force are set forth in Chapter III. Present signatures are:

**PROTOCOL TO AMEND THE CONVENTION FOR THE
UNIFICATION OF CERTAIN RULES RELATING TO IN-
TERNATIONAL CARRIAGE BY AIR SIGNED AT WAR-
SAW ON 12 OCTOBER 1929**

The Governments undersigned

Considering that it is desirable to amend the Convention for the Unification of certain Rules Relating to International Carriage by Air signed at Warsaw on 12 October 1929,

Have agreed as follows:
