Penalty for unarmed offender shall be imprisonment not exceeding 20 years. 2nd Degree: (Other buildings) Penalty: shall be imprisonment not exceeding 15 years unless high explosives involved - then penalty not exceeding 20 years.	§ 811.021 Penalty: shall be imprisonment not exceeding 5 years or in the county jail not exceeding 12 months or by fine not exceeding \$1,000.	§ 812.01 Same as larceny.	§ 794.01 Penalty: shall be death unless jury recommends mercy. If mercy, life imprisonment or for any term of years in discretion of judge.	§ 790.01 (Concealed weapons) Penalty: shall be imprisonment for not less than 3 months nor more than 6 months or by fine not less than \$100 nor more than \$500.
