Penalty: punishable by imprisonment for not less than one year nor more than 10 years, and by a fine not less than \$50 nor more than \$1,000, or by imprisonment only.	§ 76-17-11. Same as Larceny.	§ 76-53-18. (under 13 years) Penalty: imprisoned for not less than 20 years, and may be for life. (others). Penalty: imprisonment not less than 10 years.	§ 76-23-4; 76-1-16. Penalty: punishable by imprisonment in county jail not exceeding 6 months or by a fine in any sum less than \$300, or both.
