2. Civil aircraft.

2) Unless otherwise provided, the provisions of this decree shall not apply to State aircraft.

## CHAPTER II. REGISTRATION OF AIRCRAFT

Article 3. The Civil Aeronautics Board, under the jurisdiction of the Secretary of State for Commerce and Industry, shall keep the Haitian Register in which shall be recorded:

a) Haitian State aircraft, with the sole exception of military

aircraft:

b) Civil aircraft which are the property of —at least one half of Haitian citizens

—in whole, of a Haitian company or companies,

—of foreigners domiciled in Haiti or whose aircraft are based in Haiti.

2) All aircraft registered in accordance with the provisions of this

chapter require Haitian nationality.

- Article 4. (Application for registration) 1) Registration shall be requested from the Civil Aeronautics Board by the owner of an aircraft.
- 2) Such application shall be accompanied by the following documents:

a) a document showing that applicant is the owner;

- b) if the applicant is a foreigner, a certification that he is domiciled in Haiti, or a declaration that he intends to base his aircraft in Haiti:
- c) a copy of the valid airworthiness certificate provided for in

Article 12 below:

c) and further, if the aircraft is imported:

I. A certificate that customs duties and other taxes have been paid, unless there is an exemption by the President, and II. Official certification that such aircraft is not registered

in a foreign register or that such registration has been

3) However, if, at the time of application, a lawfully imported aircraft has not been stricken from a foreign register, the Civil Aeronautics Board may issue to the owner a temporary flight permit valid until notification is given that the registration has been stricken, but

such validity may not exceed 60 days.

Article 5. (Registration) 1) When there is compliance with the conditions enumerated in Articles 3 and 4, the Civil Aeronautics Board shall register the aircraft and deliver to the owner a registration certificate in accordance with the form established by the Chicago Convention and the Annexes thereto.

2) The register and the registration certificate shall contain:

a) the date of registration,

b) registration markings, c) characteristics of the aircraft (name of manufacturer, type, serial number).

d) name and address of the owner, e) home airport of the aircraft.

3) Also, other statements, particularly those recorded in the register of the registration office and specified in Article 21 below, may be
