will fill this out and return it to the appropriate people, and then this will be an indication that they are interested in applying for training under this program.

Mr. Horton. Are you mailing these out broadside to any selected competitors, or is this a case of where someone applies to the Bureau and you send out this questionnaire and he sends in his answers?

Mr. Werts. The State employment security agencies have these forms. They have been requested to distribute these applications to the local agencies, local offices, and other recruiting points so they are available to individuals who ask for them. The fact is that the project has been publicized and people are told in the publicity where to apply.

Mr. Horron. How many of these have you caused to be prepared,

and, of those, how many have been sent out?

Mr. Werts. I am informed 75,000 copies have been printed.

Mr. Horton. How many of these have been sent out?

Mr. Werts. I would assume most of them would be distributed, except for working copies at headquarters.

Mr. Horron. Is it safe to assume that they are now in the hands

of applicants and being submitted?

Mr. Werts. They are not in the hands of applicants as yet.

Mr. Horron. Mr. Reuss made some mention of instructions to examiners which were used in the 1964 test. Do you have a similar instruction sheet, or instruction brochure to examiners for this one?

Mr. Werts. I do not have it. Mr. Horton. Is there one?

Mr. Werts. I am sure there must be.

Mr. Horton. Can that be furnished to the committee?

Mr. Werts. Right.

Mr. Horton. Could that be furnished to the committee before you appear again?

Mr. Werts. Yes, sir.
