Comprehensive Planning

Some services can best be approached with a regional view. These include highways, rapid transit, air transportation, water supply and distribution, waste disposal, flood control, air pollution control and major recreational facilities. The Commission develops regional plans to which local governments can look for guidance.

The Commission does: conduct research - do broad planning - coordinate action - give assistance and advice - give out public information - help the region understand itself - supplement local planning.

The Commission does not: pass ordinances - zone property - build public facilities - carry out urban renewal projects.
