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ing legislation out of the way, I certainly intend to hold school construction hearings and education hearings in general, trying to come up with some other improvement in the general area of elementary and secondary education.

I don't think we can for a much longer period of time push under the rug school construction.

Is there anything else, Mr. Bell?

Mr. BELL. Nothing further.

Mr. DODSON. Mr. Perkins, I would like to express the appreciation of the delegation for this meeting and to tell you in your new position as chairman of this committee, if there is any way that any of us from Kentucky can help this cause, we will be glad to come back.

Chairman PERKINS. You come back anytime. We will be glad to see you.
