Whites seem much more concerned about what they feel are bad living conditions and too many fights.

Observation: This is the first indication in this report of one of the most serious problems involving the dropouts: in-camp racial hostility. This area will be examined closely.

There are also some differences in preconceptions between those who went to urban centers and those who went to Conservation centers:

Urban centers are believed to provide better job training than Conservation centers. But the latter with fewer Corpsmen per center, receive less complaints about their living conditions.

Location of Center

Most of the ex-Corpsmen felt they went to a center quite far away from their home.
