Watching television and listening to rock 'n' roll are far and away the most important activities. These are followed by newspaper reading (higher among the older group), going out on dates, and playing pool. Dancing, parties and team sports are regular activities of approximately four in ten.

Reading, except for newspapers, is apparently done on a regular basis by less than twenty percent of the dropouts (less than one in five said they had a library card).

Almost one-quarter say they often "just hang around" (This tends to be more true of the younger than the older dropouts.)

Religious Attendance.

Less than one in five attend religious services on a regular basis. This represents a decline from both pre-Job Corps attendance and in-Job Corps attendance. The number who never attend has increased:
