Dear Mr. Kelly:

In reply to your letter of March 8, 1967, I would like to insert some of my own thoughts of the teenager of today.

The vast majority of young people are men at work. They have their world-weariness and hopeless love affairs. But, by and large, they do not seem rootless and alieniated. Perhaps, because they feel that the future belongs to them, they have built-in sanity

There is, however, a small but significant portion of the younger generation that is at open war with society. Some time ago I was asked by the father of a teenager if I would attest to the good character of his son, who was brought into our court for his part in a wild party. "Sure, he's a good boy," I said, "but it was a dam fool thing to do." The father expected me to admire him for getting brought into court on a foolish demonstration. We seem to have forgotten that not everything a good boy does is good.

I could go on and on about our teenagers, but in the overall picture a lot of the blame can be laid at the adults' threshold. Now to get to your questions.

In the spring of 1965, after our flood of the Mississippi River, we had the pleasure of using the youngsters in the Job Corps for a clean up job. They did a terrific job for us and their supervisors also did a good job laying out the work and seeing it through to completion. They were a great help to our community. Should we again have a flood or other disaster, I would surely recommend the Job
