

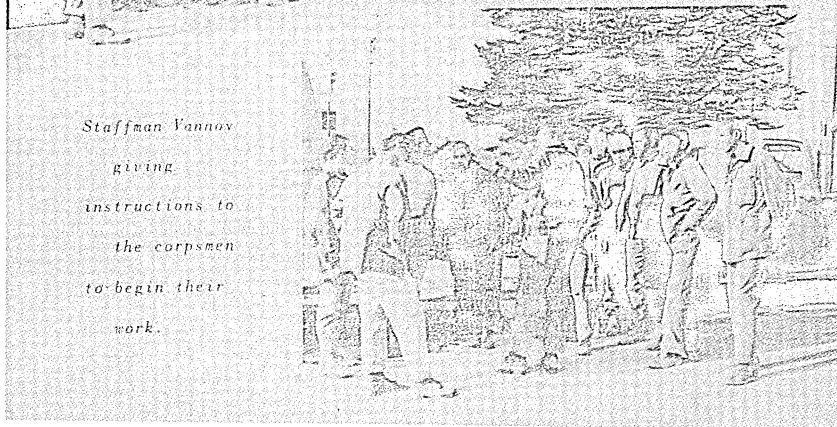
Job Corps Assists With Flood Cleanup

Director Dick Lee of Anthony Job Corps Center at Neola, West Virginia, directed the utilization of a part of the man-power at the Center for help in the cleanup of the city of Marlinton, West Virginia, after the flood of March 7, 1967.

Following an initial contact between staffman Barry Vannoy and Marlinton Civil Defense Director Dewey Sharp, twenty corpsmen and two staffmen worked for most of the day in Marlinton helping with emergencies under the direction of Mr. Sharp. On the morning of March 8, Director Lee, Work Leader Laneve, and Education Director Wintrey went to Marlinton to meet with Mayor James Baugh, the Civil Defense Director, the County School Superintendent, Ray Cassell, and Hospital Superintendent Clyde Cochran. A survey of the damage was made and an agreement reached that the help of four corpsmen crews for two days was needed.
