Take plain of Oxyletracycline It's an antibiotic, a common one, and chances are someone in your family has taken it.

But if that harmless little drug is manufactured under slipshod quality control conditions, if the chemical compound is encased in slightly acridic capsules. It can slowly transform into a deadly kidney poison.
