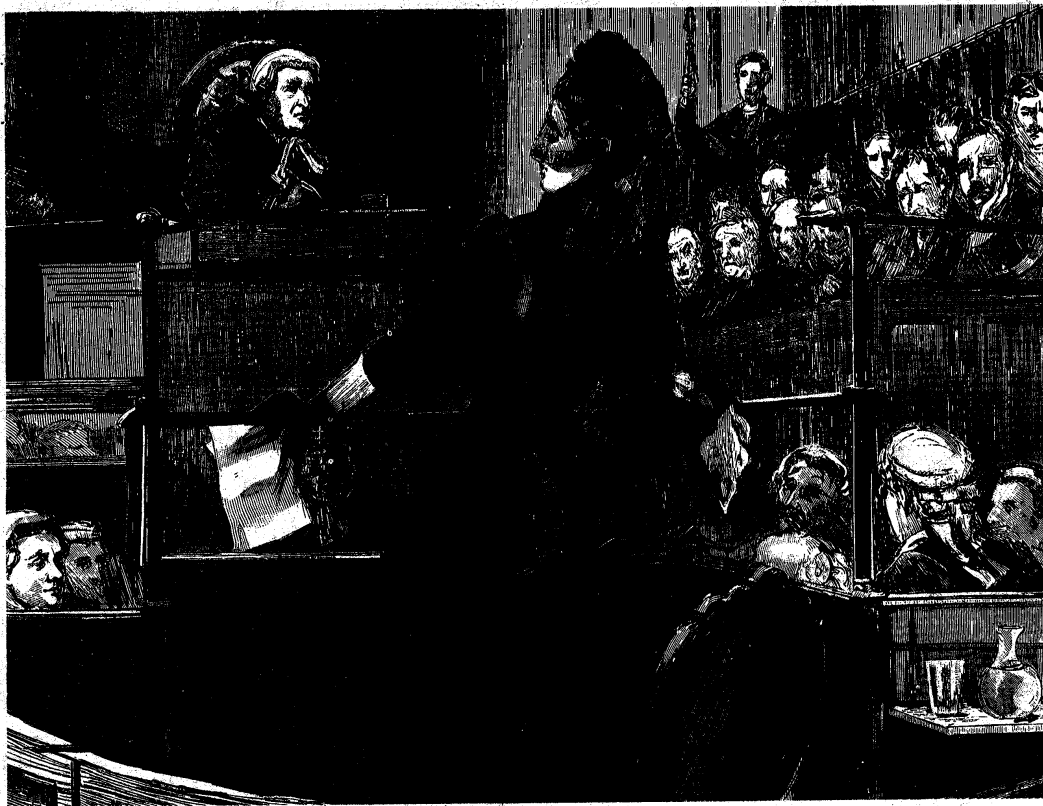


THE LADY FROM ALABAMA

The case of Florence Maybrick offers, if anybody is disposed to look at it that way, a fortuitous conjunction of Jack the Ripper and Henry James. The former's association with Mrs. Maybrick is chronological; the sixth victim attributed
