The 1976 Scientific Assembly program offers nine diverse modalities and more than 100 practical subjects to suit your learning needs and preferences. You can build a personalized curricultum around the following elements planned by fellow physicians who serve on the Committee on Scientific Program:

- Clinical Seminars
- Continuing Education Courses
- Dialogue
- Live Teaching Demonstrations
- Programmed Instruction
- Laping and Strapping Demonstrations
- Fractures Demonstrations
- Scientific Exhibits
- Lectures

Participating physicians can earn one hour of prescribed AAFP credit for each hour spent in any portion of the scientific program (excluding the viewing of scientific exhibits). By carefully scheduling your time (that is, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of the Assembly and 8:00 a.m. to noon on Thursday), it would be possible to earn more than 30 approved continuing medical education hours.

Each of the nine program elements is described below. Advance registration is advised for the first two, which also involve a fee. The other seven elements are free of charge. The Committee on Scientific Program suggests that you register immediately for any Seminars or Continuing Education Courses you may wish to participate in. Having received notification that your registration is complete, you will then be able to plan the rest of your time to best advantage.
