COMPETITIVE PROBLEMS IN THE DRUG INDUSTRY 14943

Mr. Chairman and distinguished Members of the Subcommittee:

My name is Frederick A. Rody, Jr. and I am the Acting Deputy Administrator of the Drug Enforcement Administration within the Department of Justice. The Controlled Substances Act creates a partnership between the Attorney General and the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare. The Attorney General is empowered to place a drug under control of the Act, to remove a drug from control or to move a drug from one schedule to another schedule.
