

METHYLPHENIDATE

Final 1975 Aggregate Production Quota

Section 306 of the Comprehensive Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Act of 1970 (21 U.S.C. 826) requires the Attorney General to establish aggregate production quotas for all controlled substances in Schedules I and II each year. This responsibility has been delegated to the Administrator of the Drug Enforcement Administration pursuant to § 0.100 of Title 28 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

On August 19, 1975, a notice of the proposed aggregate production quota for 1975 for Methylphenidate was published in the FEDERAL REGISTER (40 FR 161). All interested parties were invited to comment or object to the proposed aggregate production quota on or before September 26, 1975. No comments or objections were received.

Therefore, under the authority vested in the Attorney General by Section 306 of the Comprehensive Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Act of 1970 (21 U.S.C. 826), and delegated to the Administrator of the Drug Enforcement Administration by § 0.100 of Title 28 of the Code of Federal Regulations and further, having been duly designated as Acting Administrator by Order No. 607-75 of the Attorney General, dated May 30, 1975, in accordance with the authority stated therein, and pursuant to the authority delegated to the Acting Administrator by § 0.132(d) of Title 28 of the Code of Federal Regulations, and based upon consideration of the factors set forth in 40 F.R. 102, the Acting Administrator of the Drug Enforcement Administration hereby orders that the aggregate production quota for the controlled substance listed below, expressed in grams in terms of anhydrous base, be established as follows:
