

15234 COMPETITIVE PROBLEMS IN THE DRUG INDUSTRY

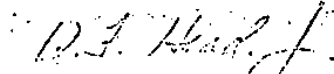
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Management of acute amphetamine intoxication is largely symptomatic and includes lavage and sedation with a barbiturate, if applicable. Experience with hemodialysis or peritoneal dialysis is inadequate to permit recommendations in this regard. Analeptics are contra-indicated. For prolonged convulsions, the use of surgical muscle relaxants accompanied by mechanically controlled or assisted ventilation, by practitioners skilled in anesthesia and resuscitation, has been proposed.
