

Dear Secretary Califano:

According to recent information we have obtained from the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA), Department of Justice, the narcotic propoxyphene (as in Darvon)—closely related to methadone—leads all other prescription drugs in the United States in drug-related deaths. In 14 U.S. cities (see page 3) there were more propoxyphene (DPX)—related deaths than morphine and heroin—related deaths in 1977.
