Whenever the physician works actively in cooperation with the pharmaceutical industry in these areas, he appreciates anew its scientific contributions and puts aside his built-in resistance to its commercial aspects. Thus these possible approaches to a closer working relationship, while sometimes apparently restrictive, cannot fail to increase the physician's appreciation of the industry—a reservoir of good will which is a powerful reality and capable of even greater enhancement. The medical profession and the pharmaceutical industry, working together, should bend themselves to that task.
