TERMINOLOGY

The term <u>generic equivalents</u> is not used in this report. It has been widely used, but has been given so many different interpretations that it has become confusing.

Instead, the following terms are utilized:

Chemical equivalents - Those multiple-source drug

products which contain essentially identical

amounts of the identical active ingredients, in

identical dosage forms, and which meet existing

physico-chemical standards in the official

compendia.

- Biological equivalents Those chemical equivalents which, when administered in the same amounts, will provide essentially the same biological or physiological availability, as measured by blood levels, etc.
- Clinical equivalents Those chemical equivalents
 which, when administered in the same amounts, will
 provide essentially the same therapeutic effect as
 measured by the control of a symptom or a disease.
