

Dr. KUNIN. May I add, Senator Nelson, if you were to extend the number of witnesses from the five or six that you had over these 2 days to 1,000, or 10,000, from the group of experts that deal with these problems, I don't think you would get any different opinion. The unanimity of opinion in this particular area is really tremendous.

Senator NELSON. Does anyone have any other comment he would like to add?

I want to thank you, Dr. Wise, Dr. Hewitt, and Dr. Kunin.

Yours was a very valuable contribution to the hearings that we are conducting on fixed combinations. We will be hearing from the FDA. And then we shall also invite all of the manufacturers of these drugs to appear to respond in any way they desire.

That will recess these hearings until May 20 at 10 a.m., in the Caucus Room of the Old Senate Office Building.
