WILBUR J. COHEN, former Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare, was graduated from the University of Wisconsin. He served as Chairman of President Kennedy's Task Force on Health and Social Security. In 1965, Mr. Cohen was appointed by President Johnson as Under Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare, and in March, 1968, he was appointed Secretary of HEW. Because of his wide experience in fields related to human well-being, Mr. Cohen was selected to open the Symposium.



DR. ROBERT A. HATCHER of the Department of Gynecology and Obstetrics at Emory University School of Medicine in Atlanta received his M. D. degree at Cornell University Medical College. Dr. Hatcher is a Board Member of Planned Parenthood of Atlanta. He was Director of the Muscogee County Family Planning Program in Columbus, Georgia. Dr. Hatcher was chosen to speak on "The People Problem" because of his knowledge and world wide experience in studying population dynamics.



SENATOR FRED R. HARRIS of Oklahoma was graduated from the University of Oklahoma Law School. In 1964, he was elected to the U. S. Senate. He is a member of the Subcommittee on Executive Reorganization which has conducted studies in urban problems. He has sponsored major legislation in the Senate, including bills to advance the fields of social sciences and medicine. Senator Harris was selected to discuss racial discrimination because of his work as a member of the Kerner Commission.



MR. CHARLES C. JOHNSON, JR., is the Administrator of Consumer Protection and Environmental Health Service of the U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare with the rank of Assistant Surgeon General, Public Health Service. He is Associate Professor at the N. Y. U. School of Environmental Medicine and is a diplomate of the American Academy of Environmental Engineers. Mr. Johnson was chosen to speak on this program because of his expertise and knowledge of the problems of our environment today.
