
## ARE SOME DRUGS BETTER THAN OTHERS?

Yes, but it's hard to find significant differences between many like drugs. Two studies have indicated these findings: the first, a comparative study of chlorpromazine, triflupromazine, mepazine, prochlorperazine, perphenazine and phenobarbital (1958) the second, a comparative evaluation of chlorpromazine, chlorprothixine, fluphenazine, reserpine, thioridazine and triflupromazine. 


## 640 NEWLY ADMITTED PATIENTS 35 HOSPITALS 12 WEEK TREATMENT

All five phenothiazine tranquilizers better than phenobarbital; four best better than mepazine, but no difference between these four.

## 512 NEWLY ADMITTED PATIENTS 32 HOSPITALS 24 WEEKS OF TREATMENT

Drugs marked by asterisks were significantly better than reserpine; top five drugs not significantly different.
