Some of the factors can be performed on a number of the above items in a variety of ways. 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SPECTACLES AND OTHER CORRECTIVE DEVICES

Authorized personnel are told how to obtain spectacles and other corrective devices for the eyes in AFR 167-3, dated 30 November 1971. The regulation also extends dispensing and recording procedures.

This revision:

1. Adds authority for the use of aircrew frames by personnel wearing helmets.

2. Clarifies the authority for issue of aircrew spectacles.

3. Establishes Air Force policy on spectacle-related frames.

4. Provides instruction for completing and using DD Form 771-1, "Eyeswear Prescription Plastic Lens."

This regulation supercedes the publication of the same number entitled, "Spectacles," 25 July 1969.

CIVIL AIR PATROL CADET PROGRAM

The Air Force support of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP) Cadet Program is outlined in AFR 46-2, 2 December 1971. This revision adds basic eligibility requirements for CAP cadet membership and participation in the cadet program.

In addition, the revised AFR 46-3:
