Propylhexedrine Inhalant, NF, 0.25 Gram	Assay limits	The lower assay limit is tighter than that in the N.F. since this type of item is made for inhalation and to readily release its active ingredient by volatilization. This assures that at least 100 percent of label claim is present at time of delivery.

Aminophylline Anesthetic Suppositories 1s 0.5 Gram, 12s	Melting time for Suppositories	To assure that the suppositories are made with a base which will melt within a specified time frame to release its medication. No such requirement exists in the compendia.
