Various Bureaus of the Department have appointed liaison personnel who meet regularly with the EROS Program staff to review progress and to develop data requirements. As shown in figure 3, an Advisory Committee has been organized in the National Academy of Sciences; this committee meets approximately four times a year to review overall progress toward objectives and to recommend additional studies to provide proper program balance.
