

In 1964, equipment in the amount of \$10.4 million from the Redstone weapons system was returned from several locations in Europe to the continental United States. Transfers of this equipment were made to NASA; Smithsonian Institution; Bureau of Indian Affairs; Geological Survey and Land Management in the Department of Interior; Forest Service, Department of Agriculture; Office of Naval Research, Naval Propellant Plant, Naval Ammunition Depot, Department of Navy; National Science Foundation; and National Institutes of Health.

Smithsonian Institution also acquired some items from the Corporal system in the amount of \$20,300.

All dollar figures are original acquisition costs.

In cooperation and coordination with the Department of Defense, arrangements were made for the return to continental United States of large dollar value excess items located in overseas areas.
