

Mrs. HECKLER. Yes, I do, Mr. Chairman.

Mr. Woll, in the beginning of your statement you said primarily the source of the equipment for AID is military. Are there other sources other than that?

Mr. WOLL. Yes. Overseas it is exclusively military but in the States it is any and all other Government agencies who have obtained property that they no longer have any use for.

Mrs. HECKLER. You also mentioned that at certain times you have changed your ordering procedure because you did not make a firm commitment due to the fact the property had been taken back by the military.

Mr. WOLL. Yes, ma'am.

Mrs. HECKLER. Is it possible for the military to keep property committed to this base for their own needs and has this happened?

Mr. WOLL. Yes, it has.

Mrs. HECKLER. They then have a right to reacquire?

Mr. WOLL. Yes; according to the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 as amended there is section 605 which permits not only the military but any Government agency to obtain property from other Government agencies if they require it.

Mrs. HECKLER. At any time until you take physical possession can they reacquire it?

Mr. WOLL. Yes, ma'am.

Mrs. HECKLER. You talked about \$28 million-odd acquisition value of property this year.

Mr. WOLL. This is from the inception of the contract in November of 1964 through March of this year, \$28,756,000.

Mrs. HECKLER. And you shipped out \$17 million?

Mr. WOLL. \$17,776,000.

Mrs. HECKLER. So roughly \$10 million is in process out of \$28 million, which is almost one-third?

Mr. WOLL. Yes, ma'am.

Mrs. HECKLER. Is that a high figure?

Mr. WOLL. No. As a matter of fact, I would say we have received \$10 million acquisition value of equipment in here during the past 4 months.

Mrs. HECKLER. Where is the bulk of the property AID receives generated? Is it generated in Europe?

Mr. WOLL. This year it has been Europe but in the past years, going back to 1964, it was the Far East because we had a better operation in the Far East in those days than now.

Mrs. HECKLER. What do you foresee as the future pattern?

Mr. WOLL. Well, depending upon the situation in Vietnam I would think if this situation resolved itself that the Far East would be the much larger—

Mrs. HECKLER. Source of property?

Mr. WOLL. Source of property, yes.

Mrs. HECKLER. When you receive property from the Far East it is transported to Germany?

Mr. WOLL. No. We have facilities in Japan, Korea, and Okinawa and the property we would acquire from Vietnam would move there. The possibility exists we will even start a rehab center in Vietnam.
