

for being here. I know you and your staff are always willing to cooperate and to give us any further time we may require in this, I think, very important piece of legislation.

Secretary WIRTZ. I implore attention to this subject. I think it goes so deep it ought to be plain to all of us and I express the real hope it will have prompt attention.

Mr. DENT. In the light of the times and the events of the day, I think this is one of the most important pieces of legislation before the Congress and I hope Congress will react to this need.

Tomorrow we will have testimony which might interest my subcommittee members very much. I think the witnesses tomorrow will present views that will invoke much discussion.

Tomorrow we have Norman Sprague, Director of the Employment and Retirement Committee and Director of the National Council on Aging. We also will have Mr. Peter J. Pestillo, labor counsel for the Chamber of Commerce of the United States.

It will be very interesting for the committee tomorrow. I am not suggesting anything, but I am saying if we are to have different views I think we will get them tomorrow.

On behalf of the committee, I thank the Secretary.
