92AID'S MISMANAGEMENT OF THE EXCESS PROPERTY PROGRAM

3. AID Mission Inputs
a. Background.—Most AID missions operating in cooperating nations have established excess property organizations to help in administering excess property. The Vietnam Mission has located its Excess Property Section in the Procurement Management Branch.

At the time of our research conducted in Vietnam, the Excess Property Section consisted of a chief and two assistants, plus administrative help re-

cruited from the Saigon population. The official functions of the Vietnam Mission's Excess Property Section are excerpted in Exhibit XI.
