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October 16, 1959 to February 10, 1964, the scope of this audit also included the same period in order to provide a large enough sample to properly evaluate the following "elements" of the program cited by the Chief of Commodity Imports in his request for the audit:

1. Operational and administrative effectiveness of O.I.E.C.'s American Excess Property Office.
2. The accountability and responsibility provided by recipient agencies.
3. Ways to measure benefits produced by excess property.
4. Degree of utilization of property transferred.
5. Capacity for effective digestion of additional excess property.

We examined the records of the original consignees for the excess property and Manual Order 1415.6, "Commodity Procurement: Acquisition of U.S. Government-Owned Excess Property". The audit findings in this report are based upon selective testing of representative transactions and procedures. Tests of procedures, property accounting records, internal controls and operations were made to the extent deemed necessary.
