90 percent current. The accounting system is greatly improved. This recommendation is being held open until fully checked.

Senator Gruening. The hearing will please come to order. Today the subcommittee continues its hearings on the administration by the Agency for International Development of the excess property program authorized by section 608 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961. One of the major deficiencies involved the inadequate repair by AID contractors of excess equipment before such equipment is shipped to foreign governments receiving economic assistance.
