ment and difficulty is experienced in obtaining approval for the allocation of foreign exchange to purchase the spare parts abroad. As a result, once equipment breaks down, it takes as long as 1 year to obtain the needed parts and to make the required repairs.

Senator Gruening. That concludes your statement?

Mr. LIPPMAN. Yes, it does.

Senator Gruening. The subcommittee will now take up S. 1974. This bill provides that excess property acquired by the Agency for International Development must be made available to local health, education, and civil defense agencies before such property can be given to foreign governments. Under existing procedures, AID has priority in obtaining excess property over local agencies.
