## LACK OF SNOW REMOVAL EQUIPMENT CAUSES HARDSHIP

Captain Gologergen. Yes, sir. I come from Savoonga and my problem was mainly identical with what Mayor Pike here stated as his, in his village or city there. They are so remote out there, if this equipment could be obtained—the problem of transporting it to our area—this would not reflect just the village of Savoonga, since we have another village there of Gambell. Our main problem in winter is snow removal equipment.

Senator Gruening. Snow removal equipment?

Captain GOLOGERGEN. Yes, sir. Senator Gruening. I know that Savoonga was shut off for several weeks last winter because of the heavy snowfall and the lack of any snow removal equipment, and that there was considerable hardship in being unable to get supplies flown in there for quite a period of time.
