of Illinois golf course without paying a fee. The president may use the University dining rooms, meeting rooms and classrooms usually without cost for whatever purpose he desires. (University presidents are seldom accused of illicit activities.) If the president had ch mistry as a hobby he could use the University laboratories, chemicals, equipment and other supplies without cost to him, and without any criticism of acting improperly. The president could sit in on any lecture of any course being taught at the school without tuition charges without being criticized. He could use all of the athletic facilities, swimming pools, tennis courts, gymnasiums, training equipment, and the first aid equipment. He would be able to take flying lessons at the University airport. He would be able to borrow any book in the gigantic University library. He would have at his disposal some of the world's top authorities on almost every subject and would be able to use their advice for his own personal benefit. The president enjoys the finest seats at football and basketball games, concerts, plays, and other forms of entertainment occurring at the
