This does not necessarily mean that they are consistent in their determination of what the law should be. In fact, it is quite the contrary. Often you will find conflicting regulations and laws which govern the very same action or activity in which you wish to engage. These conditions seem to imply that you would require an attorney to advise you before you ever stepped out of your bed in the morning or took a deep breath of what might be polluted air.

Obviously, this is not true. Most people, even those involved in substantial business and financial transactions do not need nor request an attorney's advice for everything they accomplish. Once an attorney has advised you on establishing a proper system of action or procedures which will guide you, it is generally not necessary to call him up every time you want to do something. You do,
