QUESTION AND ANSWER #10

THE MORE I LOOK INTO THIS, THE MORE I AM CONVINCED THAT I WILL HAVE AN UNBEARABLE AMOUNT OF LEGAL AND ACCOUNTING DETAILS TO HANDLE

It does seem that there is a considerable amount of detail and bookkeeping to handle. I can readily understand your concern. When any procedure involves a change in thinking and application there is some re-education that has to be completed. The truth of the matter is, however, that the details to be handled can be carried out quickly and easily since there are no unusual or complex legal procedures with which you, as a modern businessman, would not ordinarily be familiar. ABC will refer you to legal and accounting experts that have been trained to handle your questions, should any occur in the future. The actual operation of your not-for-profit organization may actually require fewer records and therefore will be simpler than those you have been required to use under "for-profit operations, particularly if you have had a stock corporation. As an idea which lends proof to this statement, there are many more laws which must be followed under "for-profit" procedure than there are required for not-for-profit operation. This means less bookkeeping and fewer reports, which again saves you time and money and greatly reduces the chance of error. Does this seem like a reasonable conclusion?
