STATEMENT OF HON. BOYD L. RASMUSSEN, DIRECTOR, BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, WASHINGTON, D.C.

Mr. RASMUSSEN. May I introduce. Mr. Harold Lynd, who is Chief of our Forestry Staff. Mr. Lynd took Archie Craft's place when he

moved to Oregon as State director.
