Note: in W. Washington, FS & BLM have: 25.1% of forest area, 44.2% of merchantable inventory and 22.7% of the total volume cut in 1966.

For the total region, FS & BLM have: 38.2% of forest area, 56.3% of the Merch. Inv., and cut 37.2% of the total harvest.
