

Hotel Ambassador, Chicago, during the forthcoming tourist season starting at the end of June and terminating at the beginning of September. When space is available during the same period, Loew's New York Hotel will offer the same discount as indicated for Chicago. At the Traymore Hotel Atlantic City (except July and August and United States Holidays) rates of ten dollars double occupancy when available.

Western International Hotels advises that it will offer 10% discounted rates on a space availability basis for foreign group tour packages of 15 or more persons at twelve of its hotels.

Pick Hotels have agreed to grant a 10% reduction on their 1968 group and individual travel rates in seven hotels to accredited foreign visitors.

6. A meeting of the *Atlantic Passenger Steamship Conference* will be held during the week of March 10, at which time reduced directional fares will be discussed as incentives for additional traffic to the United States. Members of the International Committee of Passenger Lines include: Canadian Pacific, Clipper Line, Cunard Line Ltd., French Line, Greek Line, Holland-America Line, Home Lines, Inces Line, Italian Line, National Hellenic America Line, North German Lloyd, Norwegian America Line, P & O Lines, Inc., and Swedish American Line.

7. *The National Bus Traffic Association* advises the Task Force it will propose that its members establish, effective May 1, an international group rate tariff to be issued authorizing sale of 38 one-way or round trip tickets for the price of 35 (except \$99 international fare) provided tickets are purchased outside of the continental U.S. or Canada. Further, NBTA will propose that its members file an international tariff authorizing a 10 percent reduction on charter coach rates for international travelers on trips involving at least 400 live miles per day average, provided arrangements have been made outside of the continental U.S. or Canada.

The intercity bus industry will continue during 1968 the \$99 international fare which provides unlimited travel anywhere in the U.S.A. for one month, and up to three more months for only \$33 each additional month. Tickets must be purchased outside of the continental U.S.A. and Canada. The intercity bus industry will also continue the international round trip of 165 percent one-way fare on tickets purchased outside of the U.S. as compared to 180 percent of one-way for round trip purchased in U.S.A.
