from other nonregional countries and seven from the Asian region. Table 2 shows the distribution of voting strength in the Bank as of June 30, 1967.

## E. ORDINARY OPERATIONS

The Bank's hard loan operations will normally take the form of direct loans from capital funds or funds borrowed in private markets, on terms similar to those of World Bank loans to developing countries. World Bank loans are presently made on terms of 6 percent with maturities normally up to 25–30 years. The Bank's Articles also confer authority to guarantee loans made by others and, at a future time to be decided, to invest in equity capital of entities or enterprises.
