

FOREWORD

The following report was requested by the Education Subcommittee of the Senate Committee on Labor and Public Welfare during the 1967 hearings on amendments to Public Law 89-10, the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, from both the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare and the Department of the Interior.

The report will be reviewed by the subcommittee in connection with hearings on S. 1125, the Elementary and Secondary Amendments Act of 1967, as the subcommittee considers the further inclusion within Public Law 89-10 of provisions relating to grants to schools servicing the needs of our Indian children.

It is our hope that the report will also be of interest to Senators and to members of the educational community. On behalf of the subcommittee, I express to the Cochairmen of the Interdepartmental Committee, Mr. Robert E. Vaughn, Deputy Assistant Secretary for Public Land Management, U.S. Department of Interior, and Dr. Joseph C.
