Mr. Blatnik. Time is running out on us. Mr. Linko, would you proceed with your presentation?


Mr. Linko. Yes. I better get going.

Here you see two concrete stanchions that must be 2½ feet in diameter and about 2 or 3 feet high, capable of wiping out any car. There is no good reason for the sign to be at this location. They put in a second hazard close to where one already exists—the roadsides are

saturated with this type.

As you see, it says "one-half mile." A little further you see a natural hazard, a bridge abutment and embankment. I feel the better place to put this would be at the bridge. I cannot understand why they put it in

here. If anyone hits that, he is finished.
