However, the salary levels for the 1968-69 school year will again be increased and will range from \$7,500 to \$11,350 for the Bachelor's degree. Teachers with masters' degrees now receive from \$7,150 to \$11,000 and next year will receive from \$8,000 to \$11,850.

<sup>2</sup> New York's newly ratified contract provides for a basic pay scale for teachers with bachelors' degrees ranging from \$6,200 to \$10,350 in 14 steps, effective September 1, 1967. September 1, 1968, the 14-step scale becomes \$6,600 to \$11,000 and on March 1, 1969, additional pay increases will provide for a \$6,750 to \$11,150 scale. Teachers with masters' degrees plus 30 additional credits will now receive a maximum salary of \$12,600. September 1, 1968, this will be increased to \$13,600, and to \$13,900 on March 1, 1969.
