

"Sec. 303. *Establishment of Other New Offices.* There are hereby established in the Corporation so many agencies and offices, with such names or titles, as the Commissioner shall from time to time determine. The said offices shall be filled by appointment by, or under the authority of the Commissioner. Each officer so appointed shall perform the functions delegated or otherwise assigned to him in pursuance of this reorganization plan and shall receive compensation to be fixed in accordance with the classification laws as amended from time to time".

Sections 901-913 of Title 5 of the United States Code expressly provides for the consolidation of existing functions performed by an agency, including the District of Columbia, and Section 303 of Reorganization Plan No. 3 of 1967, a plan prepared in accord with the authority contained in 5 U.S.C. 901-913, authorizes the Commissioner to establish an office in which are consolidated the functions of existing offices as was done in the creation of the Office of Public Safety by consolidating the Police Department, Fire Department and Office of Civil Defense. 16. Description of duties and responsibilities Introduction Under the direction of the Mayor, D. C., the Director of Public Safety has full responsibility for all functions assigned to the Metropolitan Police Department, the D. C. Fire Department, and the Office of Civil Defense and in addition serves in a liaison capacity with courts in the District of Columbia, with the U.S. Attorney-General; works closely with the Department of Corrections to assure coordination of all public safety functions. As Director serves as principal advisor to Mayor, D. C. on all aspects of public safety. The Government of the District of Columbia is a large and complex organization providing services essential to normal life in a large, highly congested and cosmopolitan urban community (in excess of 800,000 residents of D. C., and in addition many residents in nearby suburban areas are provided services) which must be maintained and governed at a standard consonant with its status as the
