

General McKEE. I would say it is a busy area?

Mr. BROWN. Where does this range in the 527 commercial airports, the Dayton Airport? Do you have any idea? High? Low? Middle?

Mr. THOMAS. Mr. Brown, all the airports you mentioned do have radar now.

Mr. BROWN. I am not questioning the existence of the radar. I am talking about the fact that I think that the one at Dayton handles an awful lot of traffic.

General McKEE. Dayton is a busy place, as we well know. But I still don't think it would range high on the list of congested areas.

Mr. BROWN. Well, is it possible for you to give me the top 10 percent of the airports in the country with reference to whatever congestion means in your terms?

General McKEE. I could not give them to you offhand.

Mr. BROWN. No. I don't mean now. But in written form.

General McKEE. Oh, yes; we would be happy to.
