

beautiful area in this part of Wyoming to keep that in and these modifications that Mr. Bell submitted. Mr. Bell has moved up his line up here, because he thought it had been cut. Now, that is cleared up and apparently everything has been rectified. When the question came up, both the Forest Service and industry have respected the boundaries that we have here, leaving it to Congress to make the decision.

Senator ANDERSON. Thank you very much.

Mr. BONNEY. Senator Hansen has asked the Chief Forester, Dr. Cliff, to keep him advised of any timber sales in there. I think that it is going to be very wholesome, as far as we Wyoming people are concerned, that nothing be done there without certainly the Senator knowing what is being done before the fact and not afterward. I was very pleased by your comment to Dr. Cliff yesterday, Senator.

Senator ANDERSON. Thank you very much. We are all very much interested in this. One of the best things that can happen in these hearings is to find out if there are claims that are wrong and can be corrected. Now there is a better atmosphere to pass the bill, because these things are brought out in an open hearing rather than any other way.
