Mrs. Green. One other question in relation to the proposals which you are making for disadvantaged children.

Haverford College is running a program providing for a fifth year;

of undergraduate work.
Would your recommendations provide grants for that kind of program?

Mr. Howe. As long as it was operated by Haverford College.

Mr. Moore. Yes, ma'am.
Mrs. Green. I would also ask unanimous consent to place in the record at the time, a chart showing administration appropriations requests for fiscal years 1968 and 1969 in the various titles.
